Discussion Item: Briefing on the welfare-related initiatives in the 2013 Policy Address [SWAC Paper No. 01/2013]

<u>Members</u> were briefed on the paper on welfare-related initiatives in the 2013 Policy Address.

2. <u>Members</u> asked the following questions/ offered the following comments –

- (a) Regular reviews on Comprehensive Social Security Assistance (CSSA) cases on the change of circumstances should be conducted to assist the needy to progress from welfare to self-reliance. Retraining opportunities should also be provided to CSSA recipients;
- (b) Welfare facilities provision should be specified in the agreement of development projects to tackle the shortage of welfare premises, and barrier-free requirements should be specified clearly in new developments to facilitate community care and promote ageing in place;
- (c) The Administration should consider upgrading the service standard of private residential care homes for the elderly with a view to enhancing their attractiveness to potential users; and
- (d) To address the manpower shortage in the welfare sector, the Administration should consider developing a clear career path for health and care workers and continue with the training of enrolled nurses.
- 3. <u>The Administration</u> gave the following response
 - (a) SWD had launched the "Integrated Employment Assistance Programme for Self-reliance" in January 2013 to enhance the effectiveness of various employment assistance schemes and achieve synergy. The retraining needs of CSSA recipients would also be examined with the enhanced service;
 - (b) The Administration had been exploring the possibility of reserving land or premises in new development projects or welfare facilities redevelopment projects for where appropriate. The Administration would also address the issues of manpower and welfare premises proactively and render appropriate assistance to non-governmental organisations in their development projects;
 - (c) The Administration would continue to increase the provision of subsidised residential care places while promoting ageing in place to shorten the waiting time for such places; and

(d) The Administration has always been concerned about the manpower supply of the welfare sector and has introduced initiatives to address manpower shortage. It is noted that about 90% of the graduates from classes of the two-year full-time Enrolled Nurse Training Programme for the Welfare Sector had joined the welfare sector.
